Community Priorities

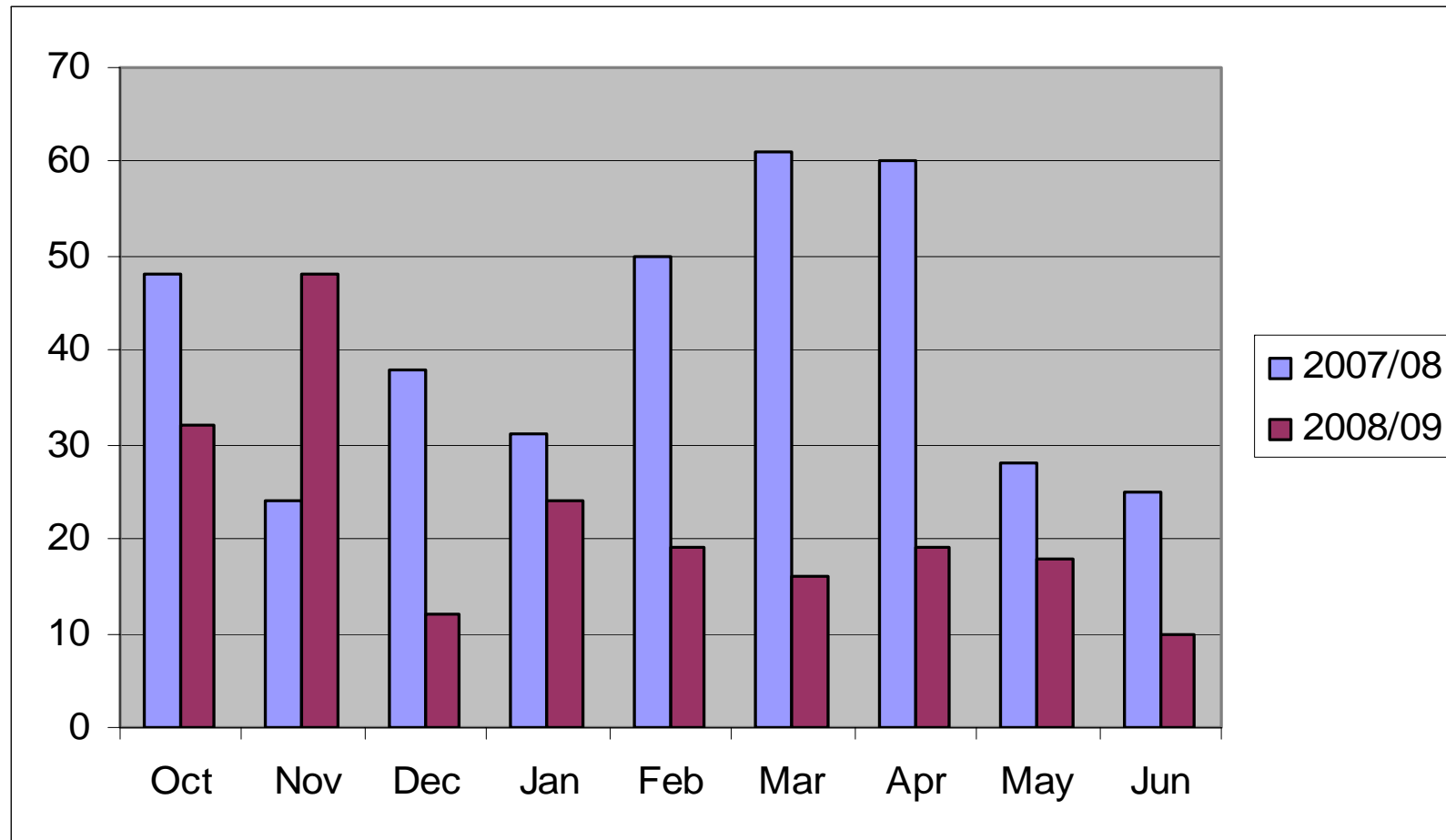
- Warwickshire Police is obliged to protect communities from harm in line with the 'Police Priorities'.

ASB - Hartshill Country Park / Woodlands

- 34 targeted patrols
 - No issues during visits.
 - Pupils from Hartshill school identified as responsible for graffiti. Arrangements made for them to clean off.
 - Local residents have reported tree house being built. This location is patrolled for evidence of alcohol/drugs.

- 47 targeted patrols.
 - CCTV checked following any reports.
 - During visits on approx 50% of occasions youths were present, but in the main no issues.
 - Group of youths ran away on one occasion.
 - 3 cans of lager seized from 16 year old.

Big Lunch At Hartshill School

On Sunday 19th July 2009 Hartshill School held a Big Lunch Event. This was held nationally to encourage community spirit, get people to spend some time together.

The North Warwickshire Mayor was there along with other members of the council. PSCO Kevin Insley, who is the Hartshill School Safer School Officer was joined by other PCSO. Road safety advice as well as offering bike coding was on offer. It was a great atmosphere with the weather holding out until the end of the event.

Pupils from Arden Hill Primary School, have launched a campaign to encourage dog owners to clean up after their pets.

Accompanying the children at the launch were borough councillors Lorna Dirveiks and Lorraine Freer, NWBC dog warden Leighton Somers and PCSO Sarah Mander.

The council have launched a Good Job scheme using fines from the dog fouling and littering to fund a prize draw for £20 and an annual draw to win £100.

With dog fouling carrying a fixed penalty of £80 anyone can report an offence to NWBC in strict confidence on 01827 715341.

On Tuesday 30 June 2009 two Atherstone reactive officers spotted a local "Highest Harm Causer" carrying a carrier bag clutched to his chest. He made off from the officers and after a short chase, was arrested for burglary, after being found hiding under a van with two iPods next to him.

A subsequent search located the attacked dwelling and all the outstanding property, including a laptop, a quantity of cash and most significantly, a quantity of jewellery, which meant a lot to the victim/s

At the time of the arrest, the burglary had not even been reported to police.

Whilst viewing CCTV footage in the Atherstone CCTV Control Room, run by NWBC, PCSO MANDER noticed three local youths who were drawing on the play equipment in a local park. She contacted a colleague in the vicinity of the park, who stopped and spoke to the youths.

PCSO Mander later made contact with the three youths and their parents, who were very supportive. Those involved have been made to clean off the graffiti, with PCSO 6198 Mander present.

On Saturday 18th July 2009 St Mary's Road, Atherstone saw the official opening of the new play area. In attendance was Atherstone town Mayor Ray Jarvis with his family, Councillor Lorraine Freer, Councillor Tony Wright and Town Clerk Sally Oldham. PCSO Sarah Mander and the Warwickshire Fire Service also went along.

The afternoon was enjoyed by young and old with activities such as face painting and free food.

The new play area has parts for the younger children and a teen shelter for the older one's.
