There were no priorities raised at the last forum.

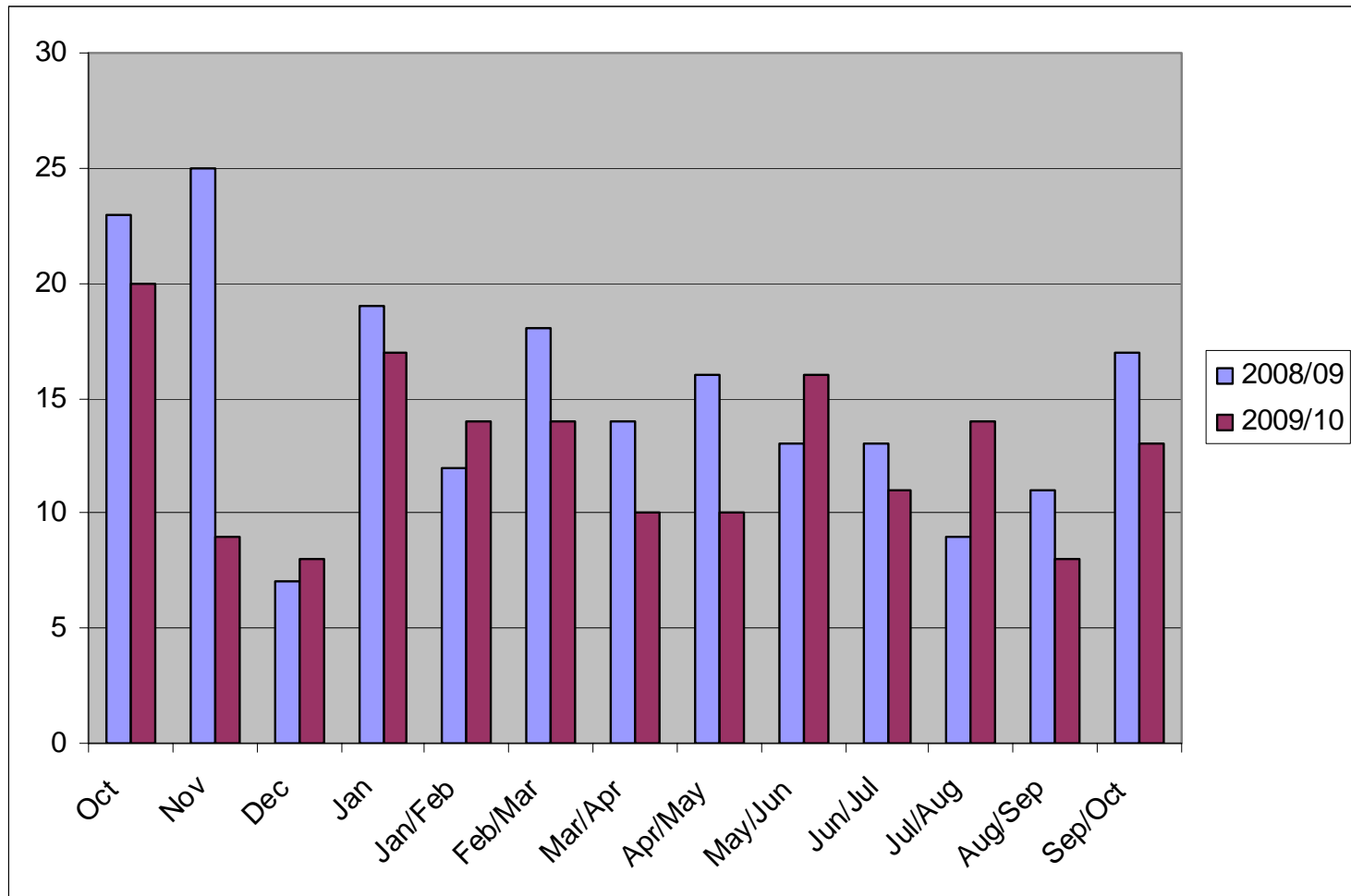
Community Priorities

ASB – Coleshill


During September three locations were identified as causing problems.

- 1) High St., this was alcohol related.
- 2) Waste land being used as dens.
- 3) Stones being thrown across Parkfield Rd.

Operation providing the following actions:-

- 1) Increased high profile patrols in areas concerned, utilising PCSOs and Specials.
- 2) Residents encouraged to report incidents of ASB.
- 3) Ensure that complaints were genuine and not one of intolerance.
- 4) Details of all involved in ASB to be recorded.
- 5) Positive action to be taken, including evidence gathering for Antisocial Behaviour Contracts (ABCs) and ASBOs.

As a result of the above issues at all three locations have been dramatically reduced.



Other Work

- The newly erected fencing and extending of plots around the allotments at Bretts Hall, which the residents have been waiting for has been completed. Although initial damage was caused, the youths responsible are being dealt with by way of Restorative Justice.
- A Domehawk camera has been installed at Gun Hill. Help combat nuisance bikes and ASB.
- The Fire/Community safety day held in Arley on 29th September. It was held to be a successful day from Fire Services point of view. In addition several people signed up for NHW, whilst a bouncy castle used by kids etc.
- As part of a force wide initiative to reduce injury RTCs all schools in the area are currently being visited at drop off / pick up times to enforce seatbelts and child seat offences.

Excellent arrest by PC Allen, (reactive) of a North Warks male wanted in connection with a number of offences of fraud and theft throughout Midlands (2 offences North Warks) and South Wales.

PC Beaty has detected 9 offences ranging from criminal damage, theft to harassment.

6 x FPN issued re parking in area of High St., Coleshill.

Following spate of number plate thefts in Coleshill area, initiative developed. This involved increased patrols of car parks and distribution of number plate screws. Incidents have since ceased.

Visits to schools in relation to Halloween / Bonfire Night. These in particular are aimed at reducing incidents of ASB.

New Anti-social behaviour co-ordinator

Safer Neighbourhoods

Ron Drake has retired as Sergeant for the Coleshill area.

Ron has successfully been recruited to the externally funded post of ASB co-ordinator.

The post is hosted by the Police, funded through the Community Safety Partnership from the Area Based grant.

Aim to proactively address ASB and engage with young people.

The post has arisen from combining the externally funded;

- part-time ASB Co-ordinator role hosted by the Police &
- part-time youth engagement officer hosted by NWBC.

Warwickshire Police 150plus Programme – Update.

Our current target is to further reduce our operating budget by £5.7m in this financial year (10/11) and £13.4m in total within three years.

Additional savings as a result of the Government's Comprehensive Spending Review (to be announced) will further increase the challenge on the service.

Rationalisation at senior management level to take place as a result of restructure.

Police Authority are considering all options. These include collaboration and partnership working with other forces. Merger with other forces not under consideration.

No decision regarding work force numbers will be made until the outcome of the Comprehensive Spending Review is known.

Hours of opening for front enquiry counters at both Atherstone and Coleshill stations have been changed. They are both now open 8a–4p Monday to Friday.

Safer Neighbourhood Teams will continue to be based in local stations to ensure communities are protected from harm.
