(agreed target of 20 patrols)

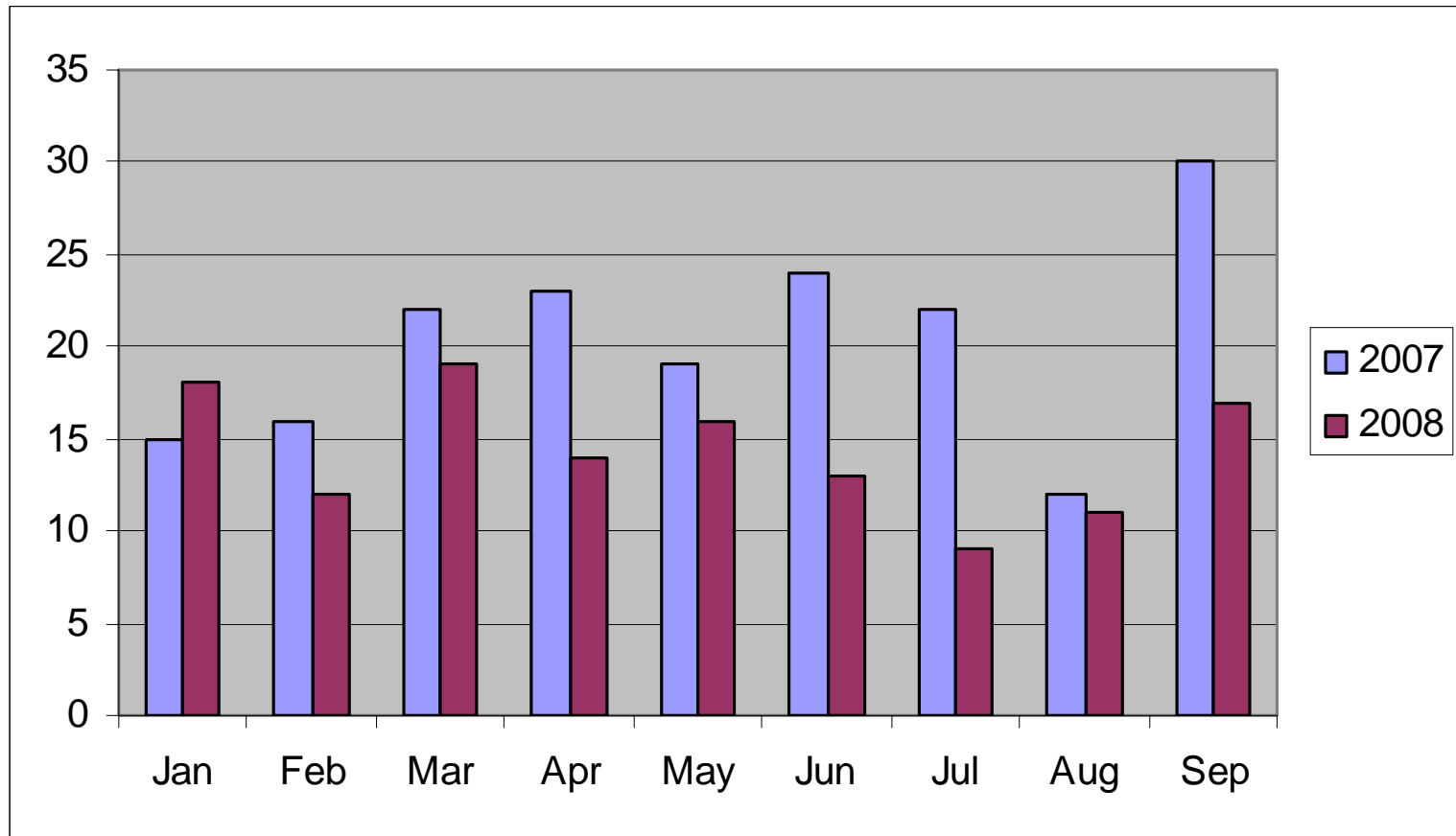
Community Priorities

- 25 Targeted patrols have been conducted.
 - Alcohol seized on 4 occasions from young people.
 - Two young people returned home having drunk alcohol.
 - Liason with Bus Company.
 - West Mids PCSOs contacted re Cross border issues with young people.
 - Multi Agency meeting to discuss issues such as noise and nuisance.
 - Meeting with Local Licensees to discuss issues and conditions on License.
 - One Licensee reported for alcohol offence and cautioned.

Parking issues, zig-zags and disabled bay outside Tesco express, Coleshill

- 38 targeted patrols have been conducted.
- 6 Fixed penalty notices issued.
- Over 20 vehicle drivers advised by PCSOs regarding inappropriate parking.

Crime Prevention Road Show

On Saturday 26th Sept, officers from North Warks SNT, working with North Warks NHW Association, held a crime prevention roadshow in Coleshill. Four locations within the town were visited resulting in excess of 300 people visiting the event.

The event especially concentrated on the elderly/vulnerable residents, promoting NHW and providing security advice. In total 58 residents signed up for NHW and large quantities of security alarms/locks were distributed.

Good News

- On three occasions as a result of information a warrants have been issued by magistrates to search premises in New Arley and Coleshill for drugs. Police Officers and Police Community Support Officers from both Atherstone and Coleshill police stations attended the address seizing a quantities of cannabis plants together with propagation equipment including lighting, heating and watering systems. Occupants of the houses were arrested and processed for cultivation of cannabis.
- On 24th Aug four golf buggies were stolen from The Forest Of Arden golf course. They were then used by offenders causing damage in excess of £10,000. Excellent investigation by PC Hopkins has led to the arrest of two males for this offence.

Good News continued.

- PCSO McGuinness has been tackling an issue involving 'Off Road Bikes' in New Arley. As a result he has seized one bike.
- He is also targeting ASB generally in New Arley and Bretts Hall Estate, Ansley. One ABC has been issued in Ansley Common.
- 3 New NHW schemes have been set up in Arley and Fillongley.
- PCSO Boulter is currently investigating an increase in fly tipping in the Fillongley/Shustoke/Maxstoke area. The biggest issue is vehicle tyres. Any information or sightings to North Warks, South SNT.

Number Plate Anti-Tamper Screws

Stealing car number plates seems to be on the up - they are then used on other vehicles to commit further crimes or even shipped abroad. Warwickshire Police can now supply number plate screws for a wide variety of vehicles - free of charge. Once in place, they can't be easily undone without damaging the number plate.

Some more simple steps to protect your vehicle:



- Always lock your car
- Never leave items on display
- If you have a garage, use it
- If possible, remove the stereo and sat nav
- Fit a lockable fuel cap
- Fit locking wheel nuts
(particularly useful if you have alloy wheels)
- If parking on a road, try to park on a well lit area
