PACT Priorities

- Off road motorcycles – Carlyon Road and Royal Meadow Drive
(agreed 25 targeted patrols)
 - Speeding on Manor Road Mancetter
(agreed 10 targeted patrols)
- School parking and congestion issues Victoria Road and Church
Road Hartshill
(agreed 25 speed checks)

Community Priorities

- Warwickshire Police is obliged to protect communities from harm in line with the 'Police Priorities'.
 - This may mean that in exceptional circumstances SNT officers may be required to work on other policing priorities.
 - If this happens there will be a need to re-negotiate priorities. This will be done in liaison with the Chair and the panel.

Off Road Motorcycles

- 52 targeted patrols completed (25 agreed)
- Utilised Police off road scrambler unit
- Worked with Leicestershire Police at Witherley
- 2 x off roaders caught and Section 59 warnings issued
- Improved warning signage at Carlyon Road
- Focus through local schools

Speeding Manor Road Mancetter

- 39 targeted patrols/checks completed (10 agreed)
- both morning and end of day times targeted
- extensive use of speed gun recording
- 570 vehicles checked 43 drivers warned
- Checks extended to Harpers Lane and Margaret Road
- Emphasis on community speedwatch campaign

School Parking/congestion issues Victoria Road/Church Walk

- 42 patrols conducted (25 agreed)
- both morning and end of day times targeted
- 680 letters sent to parents of Michael Drayton and Nathaniel Newton Schools. Engagement with Hartshill school pupils through schools PCSO
- 48 drivers advised reference parking 2 fixed penalty notices issued
- engaged with Arriva, Stagecoach and local residents
- multi-agency meeting Monday 12th November including schools, councillors, police and residents formal plans outlined for engineering solution.

- Ongoing development of active NHW groups – 4 more set up since last forum meeting
- Successful launch of Shopwatch initiative with 18 shops/businesses now participating
- Continued disruption of known offenders in area involving execution of successful drugs warrants and arrest of high profile offenders
- Increased work within schools via PCSO placement
- Continued work with trading standards to target pubs breaching any licensing conditions
- Proactive ASB work over Bonfire and Halloween period.
- Assessments on all scrap metal dealers in area

- This table shows year to date performance compared with year to date last year.
- All key areas are showing a reduction on already low numbers.
- A number of people were arrested following a spike in Robbery offences, which has resulted in a number of people being charged with Conspiracy to commit Robbery. They have been remanded in custody and have are awaiting trial.
- The year to date position for North Warwickshire as a whole shows a reduction from 1547 incidents to | 1432.
- **ASB** in NW is the lowest in Warwickshire.
