## Safer Neighbourhood Priorities

- **Parking issues – Atherstone town centre**

- **ASB – Coleshill Road, Chapel End**  
(25 targeted patrols)
- **Underage Drinking – Atherstone town centre**  
(10 targeted patrols)

  - This may mean that in exceptional circumstances SNT officers may be required to work on other policing priorities.
  - If this happens there will be a need to re-negotiate priorities. This will be done in liaison with the Chair and the panel.

### **Parking Issues – Atherstone town centre**

(15 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 90 targeted patrols conducted.
- 53 Fixed Penalty tickets issued to drivers (total £1590 in fines).
- 199 drivers warned regarding parking offences.
- Record maintained of warnings issued.
- 1 driver reported for summons.
- Continued engagement with shop/business on Long Street in respect of parking.

### **ASB Coleshill Road, Chapel End**

(25 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 105 targeted patrols conducted utilising all resources at different times/days.
  - Repeated visits to The Chase, licensing checks completed there & in vicinity. Challenge 21 policy enforced.
  - Work completed with local schools in relation to ASB/drugs/underage drinking.
  - Involved joint work with Targeted Support Team and Hartshill Youth Project.
  - Quantities of alcohol seized from youths underage on a number of occasions.
  - Assisted joint work at Bretts Hall Estate regarding ASB.

### **Underage Drinking Atherstone town centre**

(10 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 116 targeted patrols completed.
- Continuation of previous work – further repeated visits to all licensees. Challenge 21 policy enforced.
- 11 Licensing checks completed, 5 Licensing checks completed (police and licensing officer), 1 breach of condition identified.
- 1 removal of pub manager following work with DPS.
- Repeated visits and ongoing focussed work with concern pubs
- Targeted visits to parents of suspected underage drinkers
- Police directed drive for pub watch scheme.



## Other Work

- Continued emphasis on setting up neighbourhood watch schemes. 1 further active group established another imminent.
  - Emphasis placed on policing local high profile offenders resulting in several significant arrests.
  - Continuation of graffiti clean up, including using Probation's unpaid workforce.
  - Continuation of work in local schools to address issues of ASB, drugs, underage drinking.

- 2 cannabis hydroponics nursery's located in Atherstone and offenders prosecuted.

ALWAYS CALL 999**

**101 is now the number to call when you want to contact your local police – when it's less urgent than 999.**

### When should I call 101?

To report less urgent crime or disorder and for general police enquiries. For example;

- if your car has been stolen;
- if your property has been damaged;
- when you suspect drug use or dealing;
- to report a minor traffic collision;
- to give the police information about crime in your area; or
- if you'd like to speak to your local police officer.

### How does it work?

You can call 101 to contact your local police force. The service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. For more information visit [www.police.uk/101](http://www.police.uk/101)

### What does it cost me to call?

Calls from landlines and mobile networks cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day or how long you are on the phone.

### Can I call 101 if I'm deaf, hard of hearing, speech impaired, or if English is not my first language?

Yes, if you are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired you can textphone 18001 101. If you have difficulty speaking English, your local police can access interpreters who can translate your call.

### Remember, in an emergency always call 999.

For example this is when you need an immediate response because a crime is in progress; someone suspected of a crime is nearby; when there is danger to life or when violence is being used or threatened.
