4.) The services, is there really the need for a lorry park when there is a large service station with a few metres of the proposed development, most of the heavy goods vehicles are on their way to and from the birch Coppice trading estate, so if more capacity is needed then surely a more suitable location is at the back of the Birch Coppice facility where there is provision for the expansion. THERE IS LOTS IF PROVISION ON BIRCH COPPICE AWAY FROM HOMES. SERVICE STATION CAN BE RE MODLED NOW THAT HS2 IS NOT GOING AHEAD.

5.) in economic terms, the need for jobs in warehousing or HGV drivers does not exactly meet the demographic for Birchmoors mainly elderly population, and there is more than enough provision for people to work in warehousing and manufacturing at Birch Coppice. • Increased Traffic Congestion through Dordon, Polesworth and Birchmoor. Dordon Long Street is already totally gridlocked due to lack of parking facilities and volume of traffic. How is the proposed plan not going to make it worse? The plans outline that Dordon and Birchmoor can be an alternative route to the proposed development. This wiil encourage more traffic and HGV'as through Birchmoor, Dordon and Polesworth. Not acceptable when the roads and congestion already present danger to the community.

• Road Safety – There are 3 schools in proximity of the proposed development. Polesworth High school, Dordon School and Birchwood school. Increased air pollution, increased traffic, increases risk to health and road safety for our community and especially children. In November 2023 a boy was run over and nearly killed on Birchmoor Road due to already significant increased traffic at school run time. The proposed plans will add more traffic through our villages.

• Air quality - How will the proposed plans maintain or improve air quality for our community? The M42 island & A5 air quality is already over the limit of EU guidelines. The majority of HGV vehicles will be diesel powered and the operation is 24/7. This is not going to improve air quality. Electrification of HGVs and the "green" nature of the plan are unsupported. The Uk infrastructure and govt green agenda simply do not match what is being proposed.

• Noise and Light Pollution – The operation is 24/7 and will especially affect residents of Birchmoor and Dordon. The plans do not credibly assess the impact.

And finally, there is a large lorry park already at the M42 Services/Jnc10 M42 with full facilities for HGV drivers. There are also facilities further along the A5 in both directions. There is no justified case that there is a need for the lorry park these facilities already exist within yards of the planned lorry park at Jnc10.







It was assessed as part of the meaningful gap so as to maintain the separation of Birchmoor and avoid encroachment from Tamworth.

Not only does this area form part of the meaningful gap, it also has the high pressure gas pipeline, which cuts centrally through this site, which must reduce the potential for development.

I quote from the document that area 8 (in which this field for development lies) –"Recommendation – Include as part of the "Meaningful Gap" due to development impact on open landscape. Note also significant impact of infrastructure constraints (HP Gas pipeline). I am objecting to the above proposal for the following reasons:

## **Strategic Gap**

As per The Local Plan, we need to protect the meaningful gap. The protection of this green space is essential in keeping the boundaries of Birchmoor distinct from Tamworth and Dordon. The proposed will finally remove the strategic gap and we will lose our identity as villages

## Pollution

The air pollution levels are already high due to the high volume of traffic that uses the A5. Levels will only continue to increase above the accepted rates if this proposal is allowed to go ahead. Noise and light pollution are also of a concern.

## Wildlife

If the proposal was to go ahead a precious habitat would be lost.Many species of Birds ( some of which are on the red list for conservation) reside and have been seen in the area including the ground nesting Skylarks ( on the red list), Lapwings (Which in the UK are protracted by the wildlife and countryside act 1981) and Northern Lapwigs ( on the red list ). Further species of Bird include Swifts ( on the red list ) Curlew ( on the red list) Whooper swan, Lesser black headed gull, Red Necked Stint, Tawny Owl, Barn Owl, Buzzard, Kestrel, Blackbird, Robin, House Sparrow ( on the red list) Blue Tit, Long Tailed Tit, Great Tit, Goldfinch, Magpies , Starlings ( on the red list) and Wood Pigeon . More species have been recorded and I believe photographic evidence can be

provided.Foxes, Badgers, Deer, Grey Squirrels, Rabbits , Field Mice, Wood Mice and Bats also live in the area.

### Covenant

I have been made aware that an elderly village resident recalls that when the proposed site was previously sold to the current owners a covenant was placed on the land stating that the land could only ever be used for farmland. There was originally a cricket pitch and pavilion on the land in question.

### **Excessive Noise and Traffic**

There is already significant problem with traffic on the A5 and which impacts on all of the local areas due to the building of the Birch Coppice site. The noise that will be created by this further development will be detrimental to the local houses. A 24 hour lorry park and industrial units will bring excessive noise.

#### Visual Impact and Character of the area

The village is already blighted by the Birch Coppice ,Core 42 and St Modwen Park developments. Further development in the area would only add to this. I have been a Dordon resident for 30 years and i am deeply saddened that our lovely village has become an industrial estate.

#### **Lorry Park Demand Assessment**

Whilst I understand that better facilities are required for Lorry drivers, the area already has issues with traffic and this will only worsen with the two large housing developments planned in the Polesworth/ Dordon and Robey's Lane areas. ## 1) The Meaningful Gap/Strategic Gap

This being the space between Birchmoor, Dordon and Polesworth. Specifically, the space between Staffordshire and North Warwickshire. It was agreed by previous planning officers that this gap should remain to differentiate the counties, towns and villages. If this area is developed, then there is no separation and these villages will become 'part' of Tamworth.

## 2) Local Heritage

The area has a rich local heritage and is made up of lots of small historically mining villages. If this area is developed then the identity of our small villages will be lost.

## 3) Air Pollution

Currently air quality around this area is appalling and I believe levels of pollution are listed as Red. The introduction of a lorry park will encourage even more heavy transport into the area further diminishing the quality of the air, we do not know what impact this will have on our families or the young children that will have to breathe it but surely it will have a negative impact as pollution is recognised to be harmful to health.

## 4) Traffic Congestion

Currently the A5 is plagued by heavy transport and it is my opinion that it is almost saturated at the moment. With the development of a lorry park this will attract further congestion. The road's surface cannot cope with the volume of traffic as it is, with the tarmac being seriously affected where the lorries turn onto the industrial estates. It is clearly visible where the wheels have ripped the tarmac and created substantial ruts in the road which are a serious hazard to cars let alone motor bikes and cycles.

## 5) Demographic and Services

There is ample provision for HGV parking at the local M42 service area. This is already developed and is fewer than 200M away from the proposed site. 





I am objecting to the above proposal for the followingreasons:

# Strategic Gap

As per The Local Plan, we need to protect the meaningful gap. The protection of this green space is essential in keeping the boundaries of Birchmoor distinct from Tamworth and Dordon. The M42 has already divided part of the village and the HS2 buildings have caused some disruption. The proposed will finally remove the strategic gap and we will lose the beautiful scenery.

# Pollution

I am deeply concerned by the levels of air pollution already on the A5. There will be a further increase in air pollution due to the number of lorries which are likely to use this development. With rates already above the accepted levels, this proposal will furthercontribute to this.

# Wildlife

I believe that that measures have already been taken by the landowner to remove protected wildlife. It appears that bird scarers have already been placed in situ, hedges have been clearedand removed, the pond has been drained by installing a pump to remove one of the natural spring water sources. Flooding is already and issue in the area. A development of ths type will further contribute this. A hard standing area will only further push this water towards the villages.

I have been told by local bird watchers that there are many different species seen in the area concerned including the following: Skylarks, red neck stint, curlew, whopper swan, lesser black gull, Lapwings (Which in the UK are protracted by the wildlife and countryside act 1981, Nothern Lapwigs (Endanged) Bats, Barn Owls, tawny owls, Newts, kestrels 25 different wading birds and a further 20 other species. Photographic evidence can be provided. The following animals also live in the location: Deers, Badgers, foxes, squirrels, Field mice, rabbits, Cockerels. There are also bats in the area too.

# Covenant

An elderly resisdent recalls that when the site was previously sold to the current owners a covenant was placed on the land stating that the land could only ever be used for farmland. There was originally a cricket pitch and pavilion on the land.

## **Excessive Noise and Traffic**

The noise that will be created by this further development will be detrimental to the local houses. A 24 hour lorry park and industrial units will bring excessive noise.

There is already significant problem with traffic on the A5 andwhich impacts on all of the local areas due to the building of the Birch Coppice site.

## Visual Impact and Character of the area

I am concerned that the visual impact that this development will have on the area. We have lots of heritage withing the villages and I feel that this will be lost with the rural aspect of the area removed and replaced by further industrial units.

# Lorry Park Demand Assessment

The Department of Transports current 'Lorry Park

Demand'assessment does not site anywhere in North Warwickshire as an area in need of a lorry park.

Whilst I understand that better facilities are required for Lorry drivers, the area already has issues with traffic and this will only worsen with the two large housing developments planned in the Polesworth/ Dordon and Robey's Lane areas.

## Crime

Crime figures reported for the M42 Junction 10 service station are already concerning. The majority of the reported crimes are associated with targeting lorries. This will only be exasperated if the lorry park was to be granted. As residents we are worried that the obvious place to go for criminals trying to escape would beour villages, thus attracting potentially more criminal activity in the villages.

I am writing to inform you that I strongly object the Appeal from D Hodgetts for the following reasons

1 The proposed site will breach the Strategic Gap leaving no way of defining the separation between Tamworth and the villages of Birchmoor and Dordon. The Strategic Gap is at the heart of local plans and Neighbourhood Plans and is vital to maintain the unique heritage and identity of the villages.

2. Air pollution monitoring carried out during COVID when traffic and businesses were much lighter, was already in the Red zone. The proposed lorry park and huge warehouses and other businesses will severely increase the pollution levels and consequently have major effects on health of local residents.

3. Light and noise pollution will be increased as HGVs enter and depart the site. The Warehouse being accessed throughout the days and night and this only being metres away from my back garden will seriously impact on my way of life.

4. Increased traffic will add to the existing problems at M42/A5 junction. This is already at a standstill at peak times of the day and will have a huge impact on commuters, school runs etc. Also, the road surfaces are in a very poor state of repair. Given that the Highways Departments are financially and logistically challenged, our roads will degrade significantly causing even more problems.

5. There is no requirement necessary for a lorry park on this site as there is already one available at the M42 services. Should expansion be needed, there are 2 pockets of open space at Birch Coppice. The majority of our HGVs go in and out of Birch Coppice daily, so it makes economic and environmental sense to have a lorry park there. This would prevent the lorries from having to cross back and forth across the busy A5 from Birch Coppice to the proposed site.

5. Birchmoor has an elderly population and therefore has no need for warehouse or driving jobs. There is ample opportunity for employment in these areas already in existence at Birch Coppice and St Modwen.
 6. The appellant highlights the enhanced footpath and cycle path from Birchmoor to the site for work. I do not believe this would benefit the villagers in Birchmoor as drivers already park their vehicles in the village and walk to their designated workplaces, creating parking difficulties in our overburdened narrow streets. This will surely increase as drivers seek to avoid the traffic congestion on A5. More parking in the village will cause problems for emergency services and refuse lorries.

7. The green space is hugely important to me. I have walked the fields for almost 30 years and I would not feel safe walking the perimeter of industrial units and 150 lorries.

8. Since the pool has been drained at the bottom of the field, many species of birds, insects, small mammals and amphibians have lost their natural home. However, there are still many that make the fields and surrounding hedgerows their home. Developing the site will have a huge impact on them and they should be protected at all costs to preserve our global and local environment.

9. Our village has been blighted over the years by opencast mining, M42, HS2 plans and excessive industrial buildings. The appeal highlights that 3 quadrants have already got units on so the 4th (the proposed site) should follow previous builds. I disagree with this statement - if there are already three of four corners of M42/A5 having existing units - then why do we need another.

10. Our community has a healthy, vibrant spirit, entrenched in history with mining communities springing up and villages developing. This community spirit still exists today with Fayre, carnivals, scarecrow trails etc. People of the villages look out for each other and work together to maintain a happy, safe environment to live in which is supported by the Neighbourhood Plan. To many, this feels like a threat to the very

existence of our community. I urge you to take these factors into consideration when making your decision.

#### Good Morning

I am writing this email in regards to the planning application for the building of the Lorry Park and Indistrial use units on the boundaries of Dordon, Birchmoor & Polesworth. North Warwickshire Borough Council Planning Reference APP/R3705/W/24/3336295.

I wish to put forward my objection to the above planning application for the reasons outlined below, and would ask you to consider these points when reviewing the application.

Objection 1. The amount of green space within all local villages is now rapidly beginning to be eaten up by industry, storage & heavy goods vehicle traffic that is having a detrimental impact on the surrounding villages, their residents and the local environment, particularly where noise pollution has been on the increase following the erection of various industrial units on the opposite side of the A5. Bringing this ever closer to our homes will create a detrimental increase in the volume of this noise, disturbing the day-to-day life of the peaceful & quiet villages that we all were bought up in or moved here to enjoy. Our Close is directly in sight of this proposed development & our aged/ retired local community, as well as those with young families will face great disturbance from noise pollution should it be allowed to be built, and the meagre amount of 'shrubs/trees' that are no more than a metre tall and will take decades to become an established barrier are blatantly not enough to overcome this.

Objection 2. There has been a rapid increase in the amount of traffic around our already overcrowded roads and they are no longer able to cope with this, as is evident by the state of the roadways on the A5 and within our villages themselves. The creation of a lorry park that will inevitably bring more vehicles off the M42 than already do will inevitably be much higher as they will choose to use the lorry park over the other service stations & parking areas that are but a few miles away, what will the state of the roads be once there is an increase in this heavy traffic in our area. The increase in the heavy goods and other vehicles being brought up from the motorway will then cause an increase in air pollution for locals, leading the what additional health risks for us all? Is the extra pollution something that is necessary for our elderly, vulnerable & infant residents being subjected to? I would like to think that the answer to this is no, we would not because we are a caring community that has value for the people that we know & our community that has thrived for many years because of this.

Objection 3. There is already a great amount of tailbacks & congestion around the M42/A5 island (Junction 10) and the Birch Coppice/ Core 42 industrial parks, and it is evidently clear should one stand on the side of the junctions at most parts of the day, the current system simply cannot cope with the traffic at the moment let alone adding how many hundreds more vehicles each day, to cause untold misery on the local residents of the surrounding villages trying to go about their business, trying to get to work to make their living and contribute to the economy. The proposed development will without any doubt cause further delays! The only way that this could potentially cause less disruption for the local roads is for the entrance and exit of the park being solely via slipways on and off the M42, but even then this does not negate the fact that it will cause disruption elsewhere.

Objection 4. Finally, but not least important is the 'meaningful gap' which was considered essential for the identity and character of our villages, by the planning inspectorate not so long ago. The heritage and character of our villages is something that all local residents consider an important part of our lives and our area. By allowing the development of some of this area, leaves us open to further development in the future which would completely destroy the character of our villages, there is already so much development on the opposite side of the A5 which should be more than enough to create space for industry and heavy goods servicing without creating a mark on the character of our local area and landscape.

In conclusion, I hope that whilst my points above are in no way a target on industry and their modes of transport, which is vital to our economy, it is with hope that we can keep our communities safe from noise and air pollution and that our villages can maintain their heritage and cultural backgrounds without the need for this development in this specific location when there are much more suitable areas to be considered.

### YOUR COMMENTS ON THE CASE

I am opposed to this development on the basis of air quality. We moved to the village as it was in a rural location and with 4 children we felt it would be a good location for them to grow up in, surrounded by green spaces.

If this lorry park was to go ahead, this would bring more diesel lorries to the area and impact directly on the air quality in the area. Having read North Warwickshire Borough Council Air Quality SPD 2019, I believe the development will directly contradict many of the measures NWBC put forward. For example, new developments shouldn't put residents "at unacceptable risk from, or being adversely affected by unacceptable levels of soil, air, water or noise pollution or land instability. Development should, wherever possible, help to improve local environmental conditions such as air quality". Dave Hodgetts Estates say they aspire to be the "Greenest Lorry Park". However, planting trees and creating walks for the locals will not improve the air quality degeneration from the 100's of lorries which will use the new development.

NWBC in this document say that when deciding whether air quality is relevant, their considerations must include if the development:

- Significantly affects traffic in the immediate vicinity of the proposed development site or further afield. This could be by generating or increasing traffic congestion; significantly changing traffic volumes, vehicle speed or both; or significantly altering the traffic composition on local roads. Other matters to consider include whether the proposal involves the development of a bus station, coach or lorry park; adds to turnover in a large car park; or result in construction sites that would generate large Heavy Goods Vehicle flows over a period of a year or more.

- Expose people to existing sources of air pollutants. This could be by building new homes, workplaces or other development in places with poor air quality.

- Give rise to potentially unacceptable impact (such as dust) during construction for nearby sensitive locations.

I sincerely believe this development put forward by Dave Hodgetts Estates directly contravenes these points.

2. Not permitting development that would include hazardous substances likely to have an unacceptable risk to nearby areas and people.

3. Not permitting development in the vicinity of notifiable hazardous installations or premises if there is an unacceptable risk to occupiers.

4. Not permitting places of residence, employment or other noise-sensitive uses if the occupants would experience significant noise disturbance.

5. Not permitting development that would create significant noise disturbance to nearby housing, schools and other noise-sensitive uses.

Without doubt, this development will bring new pollution; residents will experience significant noise disturbance; and school children will be impacted, particularly as there is a Primary School and a High School whose grounds back on the land being developed.





- 1. The development will not be of any benefit to the community in any way.
- 2. It will greatly increase the road traffic in the village and surrounding areas- none of which have the capacity or infrastructure capable of coping with the sudden influx of high traffic.
- 3. Our history and heritage as small mining villages is being systematically destroyed in this push to turn us into yet another identity-less town.
- 4. In terms of economy, it is farcical to think that the warehouse and HGV jobs will be suitable for the retired and elderly population in the surrounding villages.
- 5. The area already suffers from poor air condition Registered as RED due to the rapid expansion of Birch Coppice Industrial Estate. The additional pollution will impact everyone in the community.
- 6. There is already sufficient space in the lorry park currently available at the M42 J10 services, only a few meters away from the proposed development site.
- 7. Since the increased traffic and lorries are destined for Birch Coppice and Core 42 industrial estate, it is far more appropriate to use the suitable land at the back of Birch Coppice Industrial Estate. This would be far more practical, without destroying even more countryside and available farmland.
  - a. Further to this, building on the land at the back of Birch Coppice Industrial Estate will not encroach on the STRATEGIC GAP between villages, which this application completely erodes.

## YOUR COMMENTS ON THE CASE

I moved to Birchmoor 4 years ago. The overarching reason for that was down to the distinct character of the village and the green spaces which gave it a separate identity to the Polesworth and Dordon. On driving into the village, there is a feeling of calm and serenity due to the fields which can be seen all around.

I believe the proposed development will impact on those reasons for me moving here and there are many aspects of NWBC Local Planning Strategy which is breaches.

Most notably is the direct contradiction to Section 4, "the Spatial Vision" and Birchmoor being part of a "community of communities". The proposed development will link Dordon and Birchmoor to each other and there will be no gap to the A5. Planting some trees in between the industrial development and the village is not sufficient to maintain the current spatial gaps.

Any development on this plot of land would contribute to the image and size of the industrial character as people come along the A5 due to the existing 3 large industrial estates on the opposite side of the A5? Having driven round Birch Coppice, Core 42 and St Modwens, I saw that some warehouses were empty and there are plots of land still to be developed!

Building on this, I would also draw attention to Section 7.27 which clearly says "Following the approval of the site at the south-eastern site of junction 10 M42 and A5 for employment use the area south of the A5 is removed from the Meaningful Gap as proposed in the Draft Site Allocations Plan and Draft Local Plan. This means that any consideration of a contiguous area linking the Green Belt northwards cannot be considered. The Strategic Gap north of the A5 is therefore free standing. Its purpose is clear in that it is to maintain the gap, both visually and in landscape terms between the urban areas of Polesworth, Dordon and Tamworth." This indicates to me that NWBC should not approve any development on the north side of the A5 as it's clear purpose is "maintain the gap, both visually and in landscape terms".

Section 14.3 of the Local Planning Strategy draws out the allotments which are close to Birch Coppice, saying alternative provision should be provided. A location on Browns Lane has been identified. However, It makes more sense to move those allotments to the area of the proposed development and there would then be the opportunity to extend that use, keeping the land for it's original purpose of farming / agricultural.

On the point of farming, section 13 of the Local Planning Strategy talks about farm diversification through the introduction of new uses onto established farm holdings. However, this doesn't mean changing the purpose of the land from agriculture to industrial as a later point in this section "the development in terms of its scale, nature, location and layout would contribute towards sustaining the long-term operation and viability of the farm holding" and "there would be no adverse impact on the character of the surrounding natural or historic environment". What this suggests to me is that farm land should be retained and this goes back to my original point of green space, the Strategic Gap, between communities.

Moving on to the NWBC Air Quality SPD, this strategy says "new developments must not put residents at unacceptable risk form or being adversely affected by unacceptable levels of soil, air, water or noise pollution or land instability. Development should, wherever possible, help to improve the local environmental conditions such as air quality." The proposed development aims to bring even more heavy goods vehicles to the area, which can only bring more pollution.

On a side note, I visited the services at Junction 10 of the M42 and spoke to a lorry driver. His view was that those services were more than sufficient for his needs and he would not use a lorry park if one was available. Whilst I appreciate one person's view is not representative of the whole HGV driving community, it does make me wonder if calling the development a "lorry park" is correct and when I looked at the Design submitted, it's clear that this development will be similar to that of the existing industrial estates on the opposite side of the A5 which were also developed by Dave Hodgetts Estates and not purely a site for HGV drivers to park up who are not employed by the companies on the existing industrial estates.

In summary, the communities of Birchmoor and Dordon do not need yet another industrial estate on their doorstep. It will breach the Spatial Gap between these communities and that of the existing industrial estates. A line of trees will not replace the current Spatial Gap and the adverse impact on both villages will be significant in terms of Spatial Vision, congestion and air quality. The rural and farming character of the area will be eroded and finally, it's questionable if another industrial estate is actually needed in the area.



I am writing to object to the proposed building of 2 warehouses and a 150 place standalone lorry park adjacent to the A5 close to junction 10 of the M42.

## LOGISTICS AND EMPLOYMENT

Over the last 15 years, this area has taken more than its fair share of logistic sites in this region. The south side of the A5 already has an extensive development of huge logistic warehouses consisting of approximately 5 million square feet. This is much larger than the original Birch Coppice Pit site and we have already suffered from continuing encroachment into our local green spaces as part of this development.

We would also point out that 7 miles away a new logistics site called Mercia Park consisting of 10.4 million square feet is already under construction at Junction 11 of the M42.

## TRAFFIC CONGESTION

As a resident I believe the number of HGV vehicles using this road is already intolerable with frequent queues, traffic congestion, noise, litter, and air pollution. The M42, which is simply a dual carriageway and a motorway in name only, already suffers from huge amounts of congestion as does the junction 10 roundabout.

We understand that at certain peak times, there could be a 21% increase in the number of HGVs going west along the A5 from this site as well as a 6% overall increase in all vehicles. These models also seem to be very optimistic especially due to amount of other industrial outlets and housing developments being built or at the proposal stage.

The proposal to add a fourth set of traffic lights on this stretch of A5 will also lead to more traffic jams and worsen air quality for the residents of the area.

It is also a concern that there are still no provisions for safe pedestrian and cycling routes into the development. This is consistent with the inadequate provisions on neighbouring industrial sites.

# AIR QUALITY, NOISE AND LIGHT POLLUTION

Before the pandemic, NO2 pollution along the A5 west bound was steadily rising. In 2019 air pollution reached unacceptable and harmful levels, yet this fact seems to have been largely ignored in this application.

The air quality report provided in the application is also very vague and seems to be based on a best case scenario. This is extremely concerning bearing in mind the high population of elderly people in the locality, lots of which have underlying health issues. The proposed site is also a stone's throw from a number of schools. Our young people deserve to be able to breath good quality air.

I also object to the noise and light pollution which will be caused by a large 24-hour lorry park It will be too close to the residential area of Birchmoor and I simply do not believe that buffers and landscaping, however good they appear to be on paper will stop this from being a nuisance and impact of the everyday lives of the residents.

## **HEALTH & WELLBEING**

Since the start of the pandemic, the availability and importance of green spaces to our physical and mental wellbeing have been well documented. It is essential that we all have somewhere within easy walking distance where we can escape and unwind. The public rights of way surrounding the proposed site has been used by all ages for leisure purposes for generations, whether it is to exercise dogs, go for a run or to listen to the song of the Red Listed Skylark. The development threatens our fundamental right to enjoy these diminishing open spaces.

## IMPACTS ON THE ENVIRONMENT

As a keen ornithologist and wildlife enthusiast I have noticed a catastrophic decline in some of our most familiar and well-loved bird species in the Dordon area over recent years or so. The land that is ear-marked for development is one of the last areas of green space that our dwindling wildlife has to call home. This follows the redevelopment of the former Birch Coppice Pit site and the subsequent extension of it into the neighbouring countryside. Our impoverished wildlife seems to be continually pushed out in the name of 'progress'.

The ecological survey acknowledges that the hedgerows, trees and offsite scrub on site are of local importance. While I applaud the plans to enhance the habitat adjacent to the proposed site I do not deem them to be enough to mitigate the loss of such a huge area of green space.

Having read the ecological survey, I must dispute some of the findings and I am concerned at the lack of effort put into assessing the site properly. Regular breeding species of current Red List status (The Birds of Conservation Concern 5) include Skylark (6 to 8 pairs), Mistle Thrush (1-2 pairs), House Sparrow (6-10 pairs), Yellow Wagtail (2-4 pairs), Greenfinch (2-6 pairs) and Yellowhammer (2-4 pairs). This is despite the land being used for extensive agriculture. There have also been successful breeding attempts by both Little Ringed Plover and Ringed Plover in the subsidence area of the site close the A5 in recent year.

The subsidence land adjacent to the proposed site, which has recently been drained is a traditional stop over site for passage wading birds as they migrate through the West Midlands. This also acts as a feeding area for rare breeding birds such as Redshank, Snipe and Oystercatcher, especially if the Tame Valley has suffered flooding in the Spring. A pair of Avocet has even been seen mating at this site from 28/05/2018 to 04/06/2018. The development will cause disturbance to this area.

I am pleased that the winter bird surveys made mention of the wintering flocks of Golden Plover that have traditionally used this site for generations. While this a species that is not Red of Amber Listed, it is still the only regular wintering population in North Warwickshire. It also worth noting that the local flock as reduced from around 1,500 birds to circa 200 over the past 15 years.

## **CLIMATE CHANGE**

Unlike some logistics or employment sites in the region, there does not appear to be any real commitment to establishing a "zero carbon" business on this site, in fact it seems to promote the continued use of HGVs using fossil fuels. Unfortunately, efficient electric or hydrogen powered HGVs are still a long way off.

it is designed to be a stand-alone road-based warehouse facility with no definite plans for rail connection. Thousands of tons of CO2 will be generated each year by lorry trips and this carbon release will not be "offset" by the proposed 6.5 hectares of woodland/ hedge planting outlined in the proposal.

## CONCLUSION

I urge you to reject this application to change the use of this land because

- there is no need for more logistics employment in or around this area. A high proportion of employees at the existing sites already travel into work from well outside the area causing congestion and pollution.

- our stretch of the A5 is already severely congested with HGVs that impacts on air quality and is a danger to other road users.

- air quality will permanently deteriorate and be harmful to resident's health.
- it will have a negative impact on our already impoverished wildlife.
- it will have a negative impact of the physical and mental wellbeing of the residents.
- the proposed lorry park is too close to the residential areas of Dordon and Birchmoor.
- The Borough Council made a commitment to take steps to address climate change. This development does nothing to make an impact to that commitment.



The strategic gap (meaningful gap) This is the space between Birchmoor, Dordon and Polesworth. But mainly the space between Tamworth, Staffordshire and North Warwickshire. If this space is built on then there is no way of defining the boundaries of the different counties, towns and villages. Traffic will increase severely on roads which are already too busy, all of our lives will be affected by this, not to mention heavy goods vehicles ripping up the tarmac on roads which are already in a poor state of repair. The M42 roundabout is already at capacity, it cannot take any more traffic. As soon as there is either a road traffic collision or vehicle breakdown the whole area becomes grid locked within minutes which in term takes hours to return back to normal.

The services, is there really the need for a lorry park when there is a large service station with a few metres of the proposed development which already offers adequate parking for heavy good's vehicles including showers and changing facilities. Most of the heavy goods vehicles are on their way to and from the Birch Coppice trading estate, so if more capacity is needed then surely a more suitable location is at the back of the Birch Coppice facility where there is provision for the expansion in this non-residential area.

In economic terms, the need for jobs in warehousing or HGV drivers does not exactly meet the demographic for Birchmoor mainly elderly population, and there is more than enough provision for people to work in warehousing and manufacturing at Birch Coppice. There are always vacancies at the existing warehouses already at Birch Coppice.

The green space, the reason I moved to the area will be decimated by large factory units and lorry parks. Surely this should be a consideration. The fields themselves are used on a daily basis by Birchmoor residents whether it be jogger's, horse riders, walkers, cyclists or dog walkers. 

I am writing to object to the proposed building of 2 warehouses and a 150 place standalone lorry park adjacent to the A5 close to junction 10 of the M42.

### LOGISTICS AND EMPLOYMENT

Over the last 15 years, this area has taken more than its fair share of logistic sites in this region. The south side of the A5 already has an extensive development of huge logistic warehouses consisting of approximately 5 million square feet. This is much larger than the original Birch Coppice Pit site and we have already suffered from continuing encroachment into our local green spaces as part of this development.

We would also point out that 7 miles away a new logistics site called Mercia Park consisting of 10.4 million square feet is already under construction at Junction 11 of the M42.

### TRAFFIC CONGESTION

As a resident I believe the number of HGV vehicles using this road is already intolerable with frequent queues, traffic congestion, noise, litter, and air pollution. The M42, which is simply a dual carriageway and a motorway in name only, already suffers from huge amounts of congestion as does the junction 10 roundabout.

We understand that at certain peak times, there could be a 21% increase in the number of HGVs going west along the A5 from this site as well as a 6% overall increase in all vehicles. These models also seem to be very optimistic especially due to amount of other industrial outlets and housing developments being built or at the proposal stage.

The proposal to add a fourth set of traffic lights on this stretch of A5 will also lead to more traffic jams and worsen air quality for the residents of the area.

It is also a concern that there are still no provisions for safe pedestrian and cycling routes into the development. This is consistent with the inadequate provisions on neighbouring industrial sites.

### AIR QUALITY, NOISE AND LIGHT POLLUTION

Before the pandemic, NO2 pollution along the A5 west bound was steadily rising. In 2019 air pollution reached unacceptable and harmful levels, yet this fact seems to have been largely ignored in this application.

The air quality report provided in the application is also very vague and seems to be based on a best case scenario. This is extremely concerning bearing in mind the high population of elderly people in the locality, lots of which have underlying health issues. The proposed site is also a stone's throw from a number of schools. Our young people deserve to be able to breath good quality air.

I also object to the noise and light pollution which will be caused by a large 24-hour lorry park It will be too close to the residential area of Birchmoor and I simply do not believe that buffers and landscaping, however good they appear to be on paper will stop this from being a nuisance and impact of the everyday lives of the residents.

### **HEALTH & WELLBEING**

Since the start of the pandemic, the availability and importance of green spaces to our physical and mental wellbeing have been well documented. It is essential that we all have somewhere within easy walking distance where we can escape and unwind. The public rights of way surrounding the proposed site has been used by all ages for leisure purposes for generations, whether it is to exercise dogs, go for a run or to listen to the song of the Red Listed Skylark. The development threatens our fundamental right to enjoy these diminishing open spaces.

### IMPACTS ON THE ENVIRONMENT

As a keen ornithologist and wildlife enthusiast I have noticed a catastrophic decline in some of our most familiar and well-loved bird species in the Dordon area over recent years or so. The land that is ear-marked for development is one of the last areas of green space that our dwindling wildlife has to call home. This follows the redevelopment of the former Birch Coppice Pit site and the subsequent extension of it into the neighbouring countryside. Our impoverished wildlife seems to be continually pushed out in the name of 'progress'.

The ecological survey acknowledges that the hedgerows, trees and offsite scrub on site are of local importance. While I applaud the plans to enhance the habitat adjacent to the proposed site I do not deem them to be enough to mitigate the loss of such a huge area of green space.

Having read the ecological survey, I must dispute some of the findings and I am concerned at the lack of effort put into assessing the site properly. Regular breeding species of current Red List status (The Birds of Conservation Concern 5) include Skylark (6 to 8 pairs), Mistle Thrush (1-2 pairs), House Sparrow (6-10 pairs), Yellow Wagtail (2-4 pairs), Greenfinch (2-6 pairs) and Yellowhammer (2-4 pairs). This is despite the land being used for extensive agriculture. There have also been successful breeding attempts by both Little Ringed Plover and Ringed Plover in the subsidence area of the site close the A5 in recent year.

The subsidence land adjacent to the proposed site, which has recently been drained is a traditional stop over site for passage wading birds as they migrate through the West Midlands. This also acts as a feeding area for rare breeding birds such as Redshank, Snipe and Oystercatcher, especially if the Tame Valley has suffered flooding in the Spring. A pair of Avocet has even been seen mating at this site from 28/05/2018 to 04/06/2018. The development will cause disturbance to this area.

I am pleased that the winter bird surveys made mention of the wintering flocks of Golden Plover that have traditionally used this site for generations. While this a species that is not Red of Amber Listed, it is still the only regular wintering population in North Warwickshire. It also worth noting that the local flock as reduced from around 1,500 birds to circa 200 over the past 15 years.

### **CLIMATE CHANGE**

Unlike some logistics or employment sites in the region, there does not appear to be any real commitment to establishing a "zero carbon" business on this site, in fact it seems to promote the continued use of HGVs using fossil fuels. Unfortunately, efficient electric or hydrogen powered HGVs are still a long way off.

it is designed to be a stand-alone road-based warehouse facility with no definite plans for rail connection. Thousands of tons of CO2 will be generated each year by lorry trips and this carbon release will not be "offset" by the proposed 6.5 hectares of woodland/ hedge planting outlined in the proposal.

### CONCLUSION

I urge you to reject this application to change the use of this land because

- there is no need for more logistics employment in or around this area. A high proportion of employees at the existing sites already travel into work from well outside the area causing congestion and pollution.

- our stretch of the A5 is already severely congested with HGVs that impacts on air quality and is a danger to other road users.

- air quality will permanently deteriorate and be harmful to resident's health.
- it will have a negative impact on our already impoverished wildlife.
- it will have a negative impact of the physical and mental wellbeing of the residents.
- the proposed lorry park is too close to the residential areas of Dordon and Birchmoor.
- The Borough Council made a commitment to take steps to address climate change. This development does nothing to make an impact to that commitment.

#### YOUR COMMENTS ON THE CASE

I am writing to you to object to the proposed developments to the lands adjacent to the villages of Birchmoor and Dordon. I am also writing this objection on behalf of my grandmother who lives in Birchmoor, as she does not have any access to the internet or have an email address. Due to the short time period we have to object, she is unable to write an objection to send to you in the post; I believe this is due to the fact that residents have been given insufficient notice of the appeal. As Birchmoor residents, the proposed developments are of a great concern to us for several reasons, which I will outlie below.

The main objection that we have to both the lorry park and warehousing units on the Hodgetts fields is due to the strategic gap. There have already been developments built on the other side of the A5, i.e. the new units at Birch Coppice. Strategic gaps are intended to prevent the coalescence of settlements in order to maintain their separate identities. If these further developments for the land between the A5 and the villages of Birchmoor and Dordon go ahead, the villages will basically become an extension of Tamworth. The land remains the only area now separating the areas. Where will the developments ever end, will they keep continuing until the whole area is simply the city of Tamworth? The Modwins developments should be a one off and not set a precedent for the remaining land alongside the A5. We are not an extension of Tamworth or a Tamworth overspill - we are the village of Birchmoor and wish to remain so. We are proud of our small village and our heritage, many families have generations of residents, ours included. Birchmoor is a separate village in its own entity, we often have local events to celebrate our community.

The M42 and Tamworth services have already been built in close proximity to Birchmoor. Tamworth service station already provides sufficient amenities for lorries passing through, why does the area need an additional lorry park? Lorry drivers do not use the service station as it is as they do not wish to pay, so why would they pay to use a different lorry park? The drivers simply pull up in laybys alongside the A5 and throw out their litter either at the side of the road or walk a couple of meters along the bridlepath to throw their litter and pass human waste rather than use Tamworth service station. Why would they make the effort to use the lorry park when they can't be bothered to use the facilities that are already provided to them at the service station?

The infrastructure is already not fit for purpose and cannot cope with another lorry park and additional warehousing units. There is often considerable congestion at the roundabout of J10 of the M42 and the A5 bypass down through Birch Coppice. As soon as there is any sort of incident, the whole area becomes gridlocked. It can often take me around an hour to do my usual fifteen-minute journey to work because of accidents, breakdowns etc. The road itself of Birch Coppice is not resilient enough for the amount of traffic and vehicles, especially lorries, that is passing through. The resulting potholes are horrendous, and the roads are literally crumbling, because of the number of lorries that are turning at the new traffic lights to access the warehousing units already in place, because of the weight on their axles. Who then pays for the road repairs? It will be at the expense of taxpayers, even though it is the huge number of lorries that have made a major contributing factor to the state of the roads.

The health of the local residents is also at risk due to the extremely high levels of pollution in the area. When the development was initially proposed in 2021, monitoring was conducted to establish the level of pollution. The pollution was already in the red and amber zones. Considering this monitoring was undertaken during a covid lockdown, what would it be now, yet alone after these proposed developments? The levels should have been green during a covid lockdown, so we dread to think what they will be like. At what expense will this be – to residents' health and then the NHS to treat breathing conditions.

There will also be noise pollution for the residents of Birchmoor. We can hear the M42 from our houses, especially at night. When these developments are constructed within sixty meters of our village, we will be sandwich between the noise of the units and the noise of the motorway. We understand that banks have been proposed to combat noise pollution, but if we can hear the motorway even though there is a bank, we will still hear the lorry park.

Local birdwatchers visit the area, as the land provides a haven for rare and vulnerable migratory birds. The fields flood in the winter and the birds use the resulting lake. There has already been a reduction in the number of birds after Hodgetts have installed drainage in the middle field. May we also add at this point, since the drainage has been installed in the middle Hodgetts field, the field where the lorry park is proposed now floods instead; the water must always go somewhere else. It has been flooding the gardens of the houses on Birch Grove that back onto the fields – after these developments are built, will it flood their houses next? Or perhaps the water will drain to the A5 as additional surface water and cause even more accidents on a road that already can't cope with the volume of traffic.

Hodgetts are proposing industrial units and the lorry park also on the grounds of employment within the local area. However, the type of employment that the developments will create is not needed in this area. There are already considerable opportunities to work in warehousing and this level of employment. Companies are constantly advertising these types of jobs. There are numerous HMO's in the area already, and housing cannot cope. Even if people were to move to the area seeking the employment opportunities that the industrial units and lorry park will provide, where are they supposed to live? And who would move to the area for this level of employment? The local high school (Polesworth) is a good school and school leavers need more opportunities than to work in a warehouse. The population of the villages of Birchmoor and Dordon is aging, meaning that this type of employment does not suit the demographic of the local area.

I purchased my house in Birchmoor for the same reason that my grandparents did back in the 1960's; to live in a small, quiet village with green space. These developments will ruin our village life and devalue our house prices, meaning that we would be unable to move to another area seeking village life. Better yet though, why should we be forced to move away from a community that we love? We understand that things change overtime, and everything cannot remain the same, but enough is enough – there have been numerous developments already and it is time to leave our village alone.

I wish to register my objection to the above planning application, which will allow a major development on the land near to the village of Birchmoor, a development that will be some 100 yards from where I live.

The intended development of an extensive lorry park at the A5/M42 juntion bordering onto Birchmoor will have a major impact on the village which is already impacted by HS2. HS2 is requiring residents to move away, which is having a detrimental impact on the village community, as many long term friends and neighbours have had to move away.

The development will bring additional noise pollution, light pollution and air pollution. The A5 between Juntion 10 and Dordon island must already be in dangerous pollution levels, considering there is the development at Birch Coppice and the new warehouses either side of junction 10. We already live with high pollution levels from the A5, you only have to walk over the fields towards the A5 and you can smell the pollution and that the air quality quickly deteriorates the nearer to the A5 that you get.

This area is also part of the meaningful gap, and I have attached a hyperlink below to the meaningful gap assessment commissioned by North Warwickshire Council:-

If this has been moved the document is dated January 2018 and it is called "Assessment of the value of the meaningful gap and potential green belt alterations" by LUC.

I would like to bring your attention to area 8 of this document, which covers the area that this development is applying for planning permission on. "This area forms the most obvious potential for maintaining a "Meaningful Gap" between the settlements of Tamworth and Dordon". It was assessed as part of the meaningful gap so as to maintain the separation of Birchmoor and avoid encroachment from Tamworth.

Not only does this area form part of the meaningful gap, it also has the high pressure gas pipeline, which cuts centrally through this site, which must reduce the potential for development.

I quote from the document that area 8 (in which this field for development lies)

-"Recommendation - Include as part of the "Meaningful Gap" due to development impact on open landscape. Note also significant impact of infrastructure constraints (HP Gas pipeline). There is a clear character link between this area and the open areas 7 and 9 to the north and south, forming an uninterrupted, continuous open area, forming and integral whole meaningful gap."

In the reports conclusion (paragraph 9.1) area 8 "constitutes the main "Meaningful Gap" area between Tamworth, the M42 and the built areas of Dordon and Birch Coppice".

I also note that an application for dwelling houses by Richborough Estates application, Ref PAP/2017/0602, dated 8 November 2017. This application was rejected, and one of the factors was the meaningful gap.

The A5 is already a very congested road. If a lorry park was developed, all lorries would have to turn left onto the dual carriageway from the development and turn at the island at Dordon to get to Junction 10 of the M42. This already very busy road, does not have the

infrastructure, i.e. the island at Dordon, to deal with the size of vehicles which would need to use the island to turn around to get back to Junction 10 to access the motorway. There would also be a considerable increase in the amount of traffic if it were to go ahead. Yours faithfully
