



^{*}A number of household surveys have sought to provides estimates of the proportion of individuals who identify as lesbian, gay or bisexual. Recent ONS work produced a figure of 1.5% of the population. However, other surveys suggest higher rates. For this reason a range of rates are used based on current population data.

Key Messages

Age and Sex

An aging population.....overall, North Warwickshires's population pyramid illustrates an aging population with older people over-represented when compared to both national and county profiles.

The proportion of men and women is broadly similar up to the age of 65+ where women make up 53% of the resident population.

Disability and Health

Lower than average levels of 'good' health.....In North Warwickshire, 79.9% of residents described their health as 'good' or 'very good' - slightly below county levels. In part this may reflect the older population resident in North Warwickshire.

Similarly, levels of disability, as measured through the census, are slightly higher than those experienced countywide; 9.3% of residents record their activities as 'limited alot' compared with the county average of 7.7%.

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Ethnicity, Country of birth, language and religion

One of the least diverse populations in the county....in North Warwickshire the 'White British' ethnic group accounted for 95.9% of the population in 2011 - the highest in the county. North Warwickshire's next largest ethnic groups are 'Other White' and 'White Irish' accounting for 1.1% and 0.7% of the population respectively.

In North Warwickshire, 3.9% of the population are recorded as being born outside of the UK - a slight increase on the figure of 2.3% in 2001 but well below the county average of 8.3%. The most prevelent non-UK country of birth in North Warwickshire is Ireland followed by Poland.

The second most widely spoken langauge after English (spoken by 98.9% of the population) is Polish. Around 130 residents are recorded as not being able to speak English well or at all.

Religions other than Christian are recorded by just 1.4% of the population in North Warwickshire. The next largest religion is Sikh accounting for 0.4% of the population.

Being part of an ethnic or religious group in an area where there is little diversity may prestent its own challenges in terms of inclusion, access to services and participation in community life generally.
